From the Pastor . . .

Dear Church Family,

Lent is the 40-day long season of preparation before Easter. If you were to count from Ash Wednesday to Easter, you would notice there are more than 40 days. That is because every Sunday we celebrate the resurrection, so Sundays are not counted in the season of Lent. In the early church Lent was a time when those



who were going to join the church would fast and prepare for baptism. It was also a time when those who had committed major sins, such as renouncing Christ during times of persecution, would enter into a time of penance and on Easter they would be welcomed back into the fold. This year during the Lent and Easter season I will be meeting with our confirmation students, and we will celebrate confirmation on Pentecost Sunday. I still look back on my confirmation class as a very formative faith experience. I am excited to get to teach these students our beliefs, practices, and history and share why I am a United Methodist Christian. Please be in prayer for our confirmands during this season.

This Sunday we will continue in the worship series Signs and Wonder with the story of Jesus quieting the storm from Mark 4:35-41. I encourage you to read the scripture in advance to prepare for worship.


